## Matches at Central Kansas Gun Club

**KSRA MATCHES:** Contact KSRA High Power Chairman John Heger for match bulletins for KSRA matches; contact information on Page 4. Note that the KSRA's NRA matches are all Registered and eligible for national records.

**Rules:** Current NRA High Power rules will govern. Open bolt indicators will be required, available at \$2.00 each.

**Eligibility:** Open to all competitors; see KSRA match bulletins for special KSRA eligibilities/rules.

**Entry Fee:** \$20.00 Includes NRA Registration Fee of \$4.50. Exceptions are benefit matches consisting of the Cromwell Cup (pending) and Camp Valor matches (\$25). Camp Valor is a 501(c)3 charity, so please pay by personal check made payable to Camp Valor because this is tax deductible.

**Entries:** For the months of March, April, October and November, registrations start at 8:30 AM, close at 9:15 and firing starts at 9:30. For the months of May thru September, registrations start at 7:30 AM, close at 8:15 and firing starts at 8:30. Pre-registration is available for KSRA matches only.

**Classification:** NRA classification will be used throughout. Those not having current classification will fire as Master Unclassified. If a class has less than three shooters, those individuals will fire in the next higher class, excluding the High Master class. Service rifle and Match rifle will compete together in one classification. Match rifle will be considered to be "any sight" except for Mid-Range Matches

(see Mid-Range Course of Fire). Note that F and F/TR class shooters will be accommodated on “regular sling shooter” targets on an out-of-competition basis.

**Squadding and Scoring:** All matches will be squadded and competitors will score and pull targets for each other by relays when firing the 200/300/600-yd. course or as otherwise directed.

**XTC Course of Fire:** 80 Shot Regional Match course. (88 shots, 800 points).

**Match #1:** 2 sighting shots and 20 shots for record, standing slow fire (single round loading) in 22 minutes. Distance is 200-yds using the SR target.

**Match #2:** 2 sighting shots and two 10 shot strings for record, sitting or kneeling, rapid fire with 1 reload in 60 seconds. Distance is 200-yds using the SR target.

**Match #3:** 2 sighting shots and two 10 shot strings for record, prone rapid fire with 1 reload in 70 seconds. Distance is 300-yds using the SR-3 target.

**Match #4:** 2 sighting shots and 20 shots for record, prone slow fire (single round loading) in 22 minutes. Distance is 600-yds using the MR-1 target.

**Match #5:** Aggregate of matches of 1 thru 4.

**N.M.C. Course of Fire:** 50-Shot 100-yard reduced National Match Course (58 shots, 500 points). Note that these are non-approved matches listed as “Fun” matches and new shooter events. Expect to experience short delays for explanation of procedures, positions, etc. to new shooters and coaching thereof.

**Match #1:** 2 sighting shots and 10 shots for record, standing slow fire (single round loading) in 12 minutes. Distance is 100-yds using the SR target.

**Match #2:** 2 sighting shots and one 10 shot string for record, sitting or kneeling, rapid fire with 1 reload in 60 seconds. Distance is 100-yds using the SR target.

**Match #3:** 2 sighting shots and one 10 shot string for record, prone rapid fire with 1 reload in 70 seconds. Distance is 100-yds using the SR-3 target.

**Match #4:** 2 sighting shots and 20 shots for record, prone slow fire (single round loading) in 22 minutes. Distance is 600-yds using the MR-1 target.

**Match #5:** Aggregate of matches of 1 thru 4.

**3x600-yd. Mid-Range Course of Fire:** 60-Shot 600-yard Mid-Range matches (66 shots, 600 points).

**Matches #1 & 2:** 2 sighting shots and 20 shots for record, prone slow fire (single round loading), Any sight. Distance is 600-yards using the MR-1 target.

**Match #3:** 2 sighting shots and 20 shots for record, prone slow fire, (single round loading) in 22 minutes. Metallic sight. Distance is 600-yds using the MR-1 target.

**Match #4:** Aggregate of matches of 1 thru 3.

**Special Note for Mid-Range Matches:** Service Rifle may use any sights authorized under NRA Rule 3.1 including 4.5x scope for all stages. Match rifle shooters using scopes for all three stages will shoot “out of competition” only. Sighting shots are “convertible” (both 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> sighting shots or only the 2<sup>nd</sup> may be convertible to record shots but not 1<sup>st</sup> sighting shot without the 2<sup>nd</sup> being converted as well; shooter’s responsibility to inform scorer to convert sighting shots). AR Tactical Class may use any rifle

and equipment authorized under NRA Provisional Rule 3.3.3. More information regarding the AR Tactical class is available from the NRA 2018 rule book or is summarized on-line here:

**April Fool's Match Course of Fire:** Non-approved; expect a variety of target presentations and rates of fire. Know your zeros and bring at least 88 rounds and a rifle that runs 100%, and be ready for most anything. Course of fire and special rules will be announced after registration.

**Special Rules for M16A4 "Freedom Cup" Service Rifle Championship Match on October 12:** This Match will be governed by Rule 3.1.c for AR-15 Service Rifle, which allows up to a 4.5x scope. Use of the standard issue M16A4 Knight Armament M5 rail system is allowed, but any rifle meeting Rule 3.1.c will be eligible for the Trophy. Variable scopes that go above 4.5x must be left at 4.5x and it is the scorer's responsibility to police this. Rifles not in compliance with Rule 3.1.c may fire "out of competition" but will not be in contention for the Freedom Cup. The Freedom Cup Traveling Trophy will be given to Match Winner (must be a CKGC member) and lesser awards to the overall winner in each classification, provided at least three shooters in a class.

**Awards:** Classes will be combined upwards if less than (3) entries per class. Awards will consist of recognition only in match results for Match Winner and 1<sup>st</sup> Place for each classification, in order to justify the pit wall replacement project. Traveling plaque only for M1 and Bolt Action SR matches (100-yards). See KSRA match bulletin for award schedule for KSRA matches.

**Food and running water** are not available at the range. Outhouse facilities are provided.

**Ammunition:** Shooters firing at 600-yd. targets with .223 / 5.56 mm ammunition must use bullet weights of 68 grains or heavier. Shooters who are unable to hit their target by the 3rd shot will be removed from the firing line. Shooters may only use ammunition that will maintain bullets at supersonic speeds. Shooters will be removed from the firing line for bullets that key hole at the target because of minimum velocity. Discretion and judgment of the Match Director as to what constitutes safe and legal ammunition and equipment / rifles will prevail.

**Weather Conditions:** Matches will automatically cancel in the event of snow or ice hazardous to vehicular traffic. Cancellation in the event of rain will depend upon expected duration and volume; decision for rain cancellation may not be made before registration begins. We will not shoot in lightning or downpour conditions but reasonable delays to wait it out may be experienced. There will not be an alternate date in the event of weather cancellation. If the high temperature is forecast to exceed 95-degrees, 200/300/600-yard matches may be converted to 58-round 100-yard N.M.C. events.

## **M1 Garand & M1903/Bolt Action Service Rifle Matches**

Special 100-yard reduced-range matches that will follow the 50-round National Match Course of fire consisting of 10-shots each slow-fire Standing, rapid-fire Sitting and Prone, and 20-shots slow-fire Prone, with two slow fire sighting shots before each stage. Normal NRA rules for 100-yard reduced match will apply, except there will be an 80-second time limit for rapid fire segments. Pits will not be used. These are non-approved matches. Special plaque awarded to Match Winner, but must be a CKGC member to retain the plaque. For additional information, call Richard Reed at 620-474-6959 or email to peelsrick@hotmail.com. Followed by 22-cal any-rifle, any-sight, any-position match at 100-yards, 2-sighting shots and 20 shots for record in time limit of 22-minutes.

## **THE DEAN NELSON TRAVELING TROPHY**

**The Dean Nelson Traveling Trophy** is awarded each year to the shooter who has accumulated the most total points of all the CKGC 200/300/600-yard XTC matches plus the M1 Garand and Bolt Action Service Rifle matches thru the Annual Picnic. Additionally, only scores fired using the appropriate rifle during the M1 and BASR matches will count toward the trophy. The 100-yard “fun” matches, the April Fool’s match, the Cromwell Cup and the KSRA matches will not count toward the trophy. The trophy is named for Norman Dean Nelson (1937 – 1997), a member of Central Kansas Gun Club and a fierce high power rifle competitor in Kansas for many years. The inscription on the Trophy reads “He was always willing to share his knowledge with others and particularly enjoyed instructing those who showed an interest in high power shooting,” which is a masterpiece of understatement. Dean has left the range now; we are diminished.

## **CROMWELL CUP MEMORIAL MATCHES**

*Will be held Sunday September 29, 2019 at the Oklahoma City Gun Club Range*

Guy Cromwell was well known to Oklahoma and Kansas high power rifle shooters and passed away in 2008. Beginning in 2009 with the inaugural match in Hutchinson, this memorial match and the Cromwell Cup Trophy formerly alternated between Hutchinson and Guy’s home range at the Oklahoma City Gun Club at Arcadia, OK north of Oklahoma City. Proceeds are donated to youth marksmanship programs, with which Guy was heavily involved. It is not a bad way to be remembered, when you think about it. Beginning in 2017, the Cromwell Cup Match was moved permanently to OKCGC, largely because of the disparity in attendance possible between the two clubs because of club sizes. Proceeds will be distributed proportionally between the two clubs according to percentage of attendance. For 2019, this will be a 1,000-point 100-shot CMP-approved “across-the-course” 200/300/600-yard match, with two 600-yard segments (sighting shots allowed).

## **Special Notice for F-Class & F/TR Shooters**

There has not been any particular interest in F or F/TR class shooting at Central Kansas Gun Club, despite a wide interest in this discipline elsewhere about the country. We do not have F targets at CKGC, but would entertain a proposal to accommodate an F-Class program in the future if sufficient

interest presents itself. But we have to know about the interest before we will try to accommodate it. Contact the program chairmen to discuss, or present yourself at any of the matches, and we'll see what might be worked out.

Additionally, any F or F/TR shooter who shows up at the CKGC or KSRA Mid-Range matches will be accommodated on the regular "sling" target on an out of competition basis with scores not reportable to NRA or eligible for awards. Certainly not ideal, but at least it will get you on the range! ***THIS COULD BECOME A THING IF THERE IS ENOUGH INTEREST!!!!!!***
